



# 2010 Prep Campus Uniform Update

## Compliance Guidelines & New Options for Prep Campus Students

Every spring, we survey our parents, students and faculty about their school experience over the previous year. We value the feedback we get in these surveys; this year, one theme came through very clearly: It is time for our student dress code to look sharp! We also had a committee of students come to the administration this spring with a professional presentation on a uniform look that they believe would reflect the excellence of our school and allow our students to have a unique identity in the community. As a result, we have added some items that will be options this year and will be phased in over the next two years as required pieces for the SCS uniform. These new guidelines will be published in the 2010-2011 Handbook in August, but since many of you are making your uniform purchases now, we wanted to get this information out to you as soon as possible.

### New Uniform Items

#### For Boys and Girls:

- Navy blazer
- Navy sweater vest and cardigan
- Black "Northface-style" cold weather jacket

#### For Boys

- Navy striped polo- may be worn untucked
- Navy pullover sweater
- SCS tie for blazer
- Loafers or lace-up shoes

#### For Girls

- Plaid skirt
- Criss-cross tie for Blazer
- Loafers, Mary Janes, or s

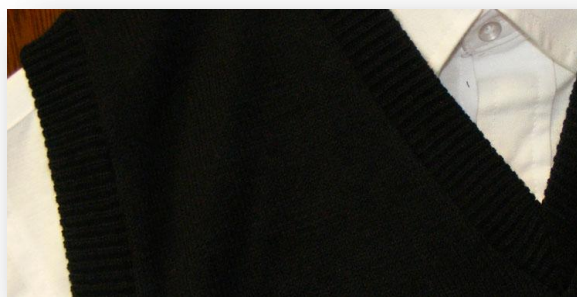


The blazer, plaid skirt, and ties, worn with white oxford shirt and dress shoes, comprise our new "Dress Uniform". The dress uniform may be worn at any time. This year it will be our preferred apparel for school ceremonies, certain school trips, and student appearances at competitions and other interscholastic events, and in the year 2011-2012, the Dress Uniform will be required for these occasions. After the 2010-2011 school year, students will have specific guidelines for shoe selection for both the regular and dress uniforms.

## New Uniform Guidelines

### Socks and stockings

- Socks, stockings, leggings or knee-highs must be solid black, white or gray only



### Outerwear

- All SCS-issued outerwear (Athletics, Booster Club, PTO, etc.)
- Monogrammed SCS sweatshirts or jackets
- Standard uniform must be worn under outerwear



### Shoes

- No flip flops, athletic sandals, or house shoes. Western boots are acceptable only with pants.
- Girls may wear “Ugg-style” boots November through March

### Spirit Day

- Blue jeans without tears or holes
- SCS-issued t-shirt (does not include t-shirts purchased on school trips)
- SCS-issued sweatshirts or jackets

### Athletics

- For practice and during the athletic period, all students will be in SCS-issued athletic practice uniforms as directed by their coaches
- Game Days – Athletes may wear attire approved in advance by the Administration

## Senior Dress Code

### (Also used for other grades for out-of-uniform days)

Senior dress code is an option for second semester seniors on Friday. The dress code follows **business casual** guidelines and is consistent with regular SCS dress code guidelines regarding skirt length, modest necklines, and sleeves on shirts. Shoes also should be business casual.

- Dress pants with a belt
- Denim jeans without holes, tears or fringes (belts required/appropriate fit)
- Business casual shirts or blouses with sleeves
- Business casual skirts or dresses no shorter than 3” above the front and back of the knee
- Guys can wear **dress** shorts.
- Shirts with a straight hem do not need to be tucked in. All other shirts must be tucked in.
- No big lettering or logos; no inappropriate sayings
- College shirts and small logos are acceptable.

Please note that Senior Dress code does not include leisure wear or flip flops.

## Enforcement

- When a student is out of uniform, he or she will receive a demerit. Parents will be notified and will be required to bring the appropriate clothing in order for the student to return to class.
- Subsequent violations may result in a detention, Saturday class, or suspension.
- If a student does not have on the appropriate dress for a scheduled field trip, he or she forfeits the right to go on the field trip.
- Dress code violations are cumulative. A new count will begin at the end of each quarter.

## General Rules Applying to All Prep Campus Students

### Appearance:

- Dresses and skirts cannot exceed three inches above the knee.
- No excessively tight clothing.
- No torn or frayed edges.
- No revealing necklines or open backs.
- Undergarments or non-uniform clothing layers must not be visible at any time.
- No bare midriffs.
- Solid white, black or gray socks are required when appropriate.
- Belts are required with looped pants/shorts.
- Shirts with tails must be long enough to be tucked in and must remain tucked in at all times.
- Jewelry and makeup should not be distracting; earrings are allowed for girls only.
- No visible tattoos.
- Caps are not allowed except during athletic events and practices at coach's discretion.
- No body piercings.

### Grooming:

- Hair must be neatly groomed and naturally colored.
- Boys' hair must be above the collar.
- Boys must be clean shaven. No beards or mustaches are allowed and sideburns must not extend below the ears.
- Boys are not allowed to wear make-up or nail polish.

### When Uniforms are Worn

All SCS students are required to wear the designated uniform to school each day unless it is a designated "Out of Uniform" or "Spirit Day". Uniforms will be worn on all school field trips and/or other school trips where SCS students travel away from the SCS campus unless other arrangements are approved by the Administration. If a student does not have on the appropriate dress for a field trip, he or she will not be allowed to participate.
